Prevention Rules for COVID-19

These prevention rules are in accordance
with KCDC guidelines(Feb. 20).



1. **Wash your hands** frequently and thoroughly with **soap** and **running water** for more than 30 seconds.
2. **Do not touch** your **eyes, nose, or mouth** with unwashed hands.



3. **Cover your mouth** and nose with your **sleeve** when **coughing** or sneezing.
4. **Avoid contact** with people who have symptoms such as **fever, cough,** or other **respiratory symptoms**.



5. **Wear a mask and avoid visiting crowded places.**
 - ▶ If you are **elderly/pregnant** or have **chronic conditions**, you **MUST** wear a mask when going outside.
 - ▶ If you show symptoms such as **fever, cough,** or other **respiratory symptoms**, please refrain from taking off your mask.

※ If you have mild fever, cough, or other respiratory symptoms, please avoid visiting hospitals and emergency rooms. Call the numbers above first and follow the instructions. **Only if required**, visit designated clinics for triage.

※ When visiting hospitals or clinics, please wear a mask and avoid using public transportation. Please use your personal means of transportation to prevent infections.

Seoul's Code of Conduct for International Students Arriving from Countries with Outbreak of COVID-19



1. Before departure

- ① If you show any symptoms*, enter the country after complete recovery.
*Symptoms include fever, cough, and respiratory failure.
- ② Check university announcements (i.e. academic calendar, distance learning, permitted absence, etc.) and provide your university with arrival information and information regarding the usage of dormitory and other campus facilities.
- ③ Check if you are eligible for permitted absence due to delayed visa issuance, unconfirmed arrival date, etc.

2. Upon arrival in Korea

- ① All international students arriving from countries with outbreak of COVID-19 must follow the extra arrival procedure and get checked in case of any infection.
 - ☞ Upon arrival, please follow the instruction in order to install and use the mobile app provided by the Ministry of Health and Welfare, and submit a quarantine report as well as a health condition questionnaire.
- ② Immediately after arrival, visit the "Information Center for International Students from Countries with Outbreak of COVID-19" to receive information on the shuttle bus service and campus guidelines.
 - ☞ Locations: (Terminal 1) Booth 17 between Arrival Halls A and B on 1F
(Terminal 2) Booth 3 between Arrival Halls A and B on 1F

3. After arrival(for 14 days)

- ① 14 days of permitted absence for attendance
 - ☞ Students must stay indoors (dormitory or residence), and avoid contact with others.
- ② Give detailed answers of your symptoms when proceeding daily monitoring phone calls (twice a day) by the university or health authorities, and update your status on designated mobile app.
 - * Upon any signs of symptoms, immediately report to the health authorities (call 1339) or Dasan Seoul Call Center (call 02-120) as well as your university.
 - ☞ For foreign language services, call 1330 / 1345 / 02-120.

4. After 14 days

- ① Get final confirmation of your symptoms and attend university under the school's guidance after reporting your current status.
- ② Please keep following the prevention rules.
